Dear Zhem-man,

I have attached a copy of an email which was sent on 27 May 2008 in response to your follow up query on 26 May 2008. It is below in italics:

Sorry for any misunderstanding as I believe I was quite clear in stating a fee is payable on or before 12 June 2008 for application 2003248601. The PCT filing fees that you paid when you originally filed your application does not cover any fees that are applicable when an application enters Nation Phase in the states you designated when filing your PCT application. Below is the link to the website you stated did not work for you previously, which specifies the fees that are payable to keep your patent in force.

The 5th year fee of \$250 AUD is due for your application, as I stated previously, on or before the 12<sup>th</sup> of June 2008. I believe you have taken the PCT Applicants guide out of context as it is not the case that by paying your PCT filing fees you are automatically paid in full for the duration of your patent. If the above link does not work, (which it should) I have coppied the relevant fee schedule from the IP Australia website for your records.
